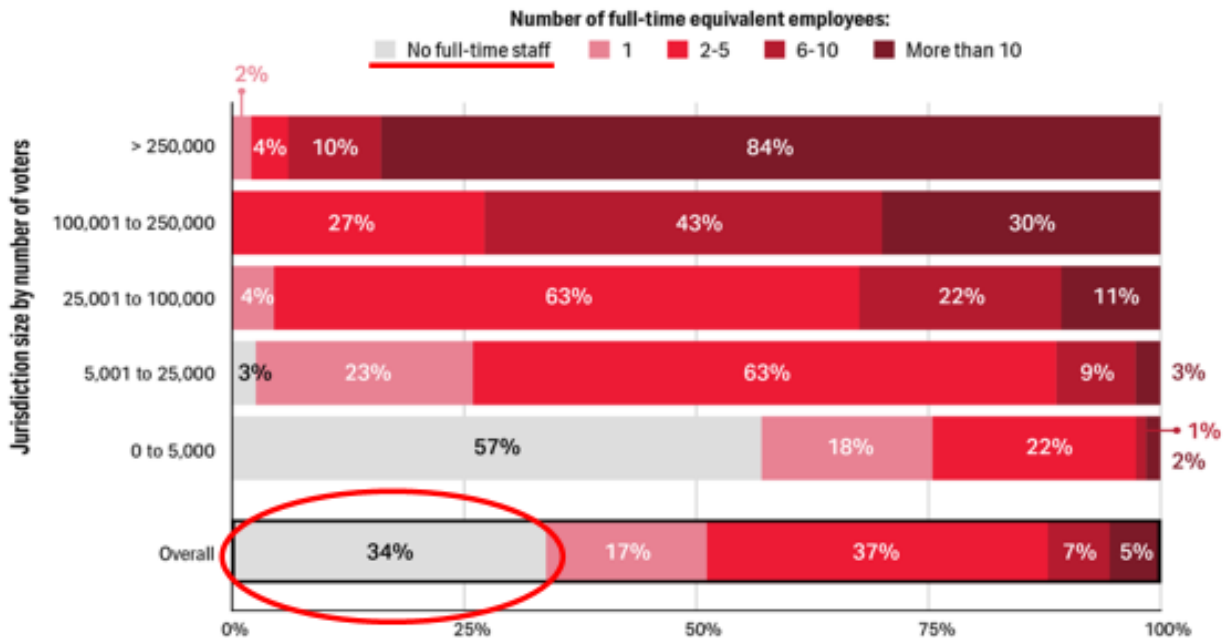

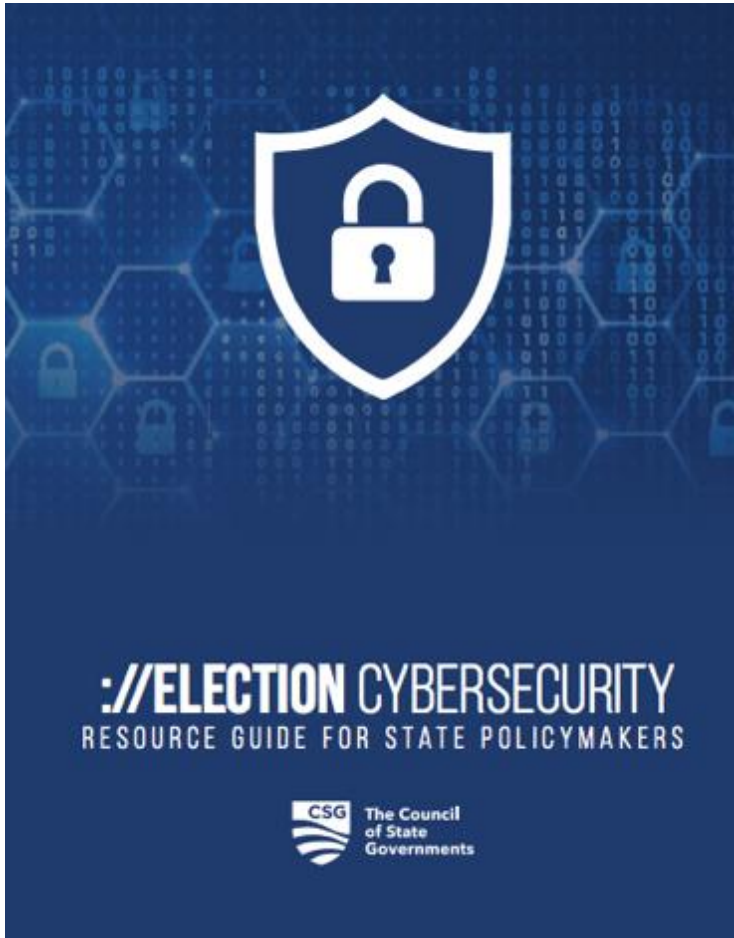

The office conducts a process called 'Logic & Accuracy' testing (L&A) before each election. During this process, a bi-partisan team of election officers verifies the programming of each machine and conducts a thorough test to ensure results are calculated correctly.

St. Louis County, MO

- Not all details will be disclosed.



- Documenting and discussing security measures and having robust chain of custody notations is ever increasingly important.
- Public confidence rests on our ability to demonstrate nothing was tampered with.

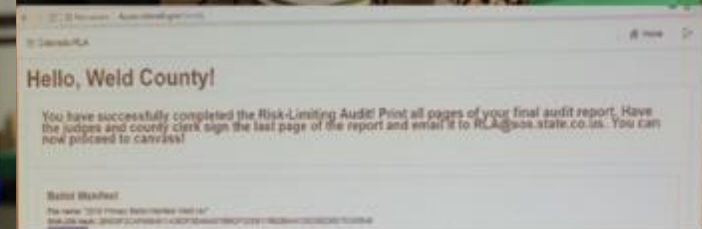
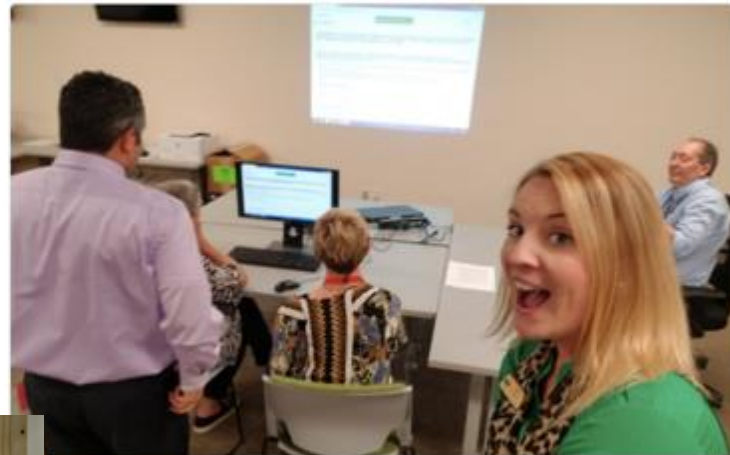




With unofficial results finished on election night, now our boards can begin counting provisional ballots and absentees that arrived after Election Day and within the window prescribed by law.

The bipartisan team in Brown County started their final tabulation today!



Brown County, OH has a population of less than 44K. Maricopa County has 2.5M registered voters, 1.56M voted in 2022 Midterm. Their official canvass was done 2 days later, but they also do their hand count audit BEFORE the canvass.



Maricopa County Elections Depart... @Maricopa · Nov 21, 2022

Final results have been posted showing 1.56 million voters cast a ballot. This exceeded the historic average of 56.3% going back five decades, just behind the record high turnout in 2018 of 65.5%. Find the totals at Results.Maricopa.Vote

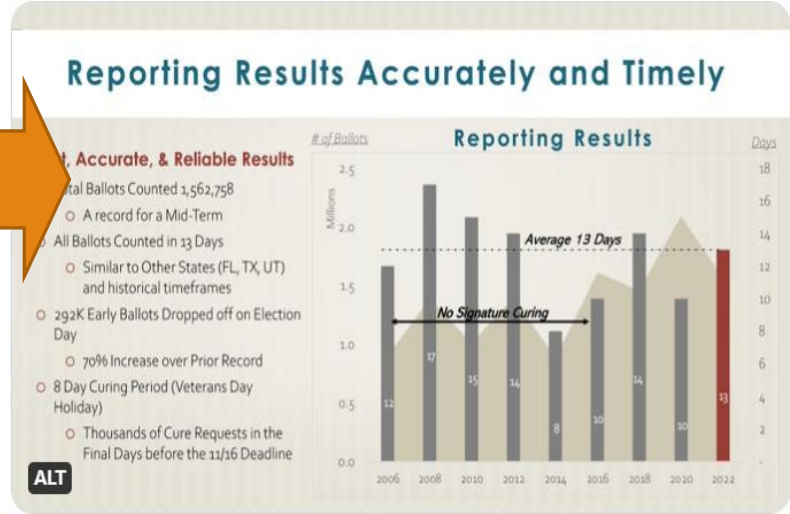

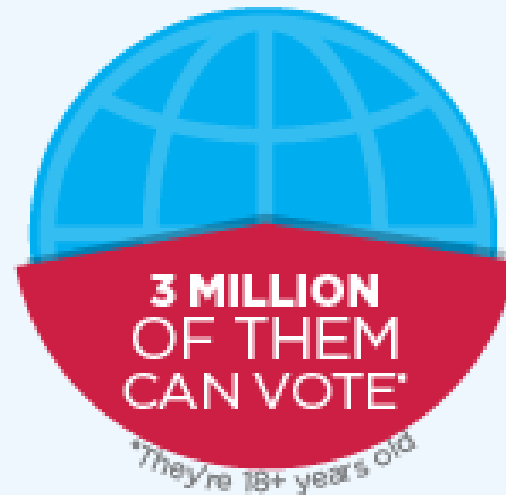
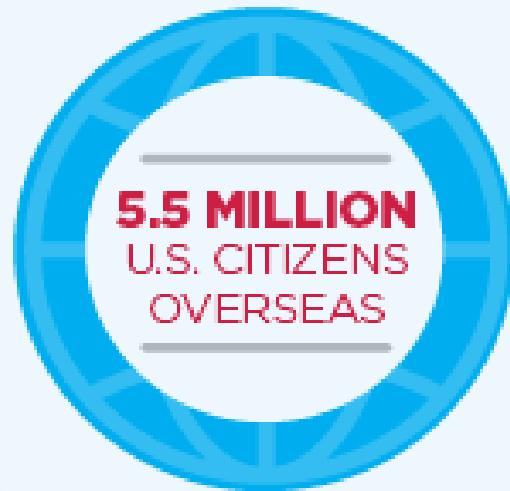

How to properly complete your
Pennsylvania Mail-in Ballot



1 Complete your ballot in blue or black ink.



2 Insert your completed ballot into the small ballot envelope. If your ballot is not inside the small envelope, it will be considered a "naked ballot" and will NOT be counted.
(Think of it as underwear for your ballot.)



3 Place your sealed ballot envelope into the larger return envelope.
(This would be your ballot's pants.)



4 Seal the return envelope and sign and date the voter declaration. Your ballot is ready to be mailed.
