

Medicaid is *jointly funded* by both feds and states / territories.

Figure 1: Federal Review and Matching of Estimated State Medicaid Expenditures

The *Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP)* rate determines the percentage of the federal and state share for each state or territory.

- Base FMAP rate for states FMAP for states varies by is adjusted annually based on *a state's relative per* capita income
- - Service
 - **Population**
 - Activity

Multiple mechanisms to finance the state or territorial share

State Share

- General Fund
- Health Care-Related Taxes / Provider Taxes
- Certified Public Expenditures
- Intergovernmental Transfers

Territorial Share

- General Fund
- Certified Public Expenditures

- Medicaid costs fluctuate with actual expenditures (services, enrollment, administrative costs).





Figure 1: CAA Timeline of Key Medicaid Unwinding Provisions Included in the CAA, 20231





- ARPA Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) funding *spent by March 2025*.


