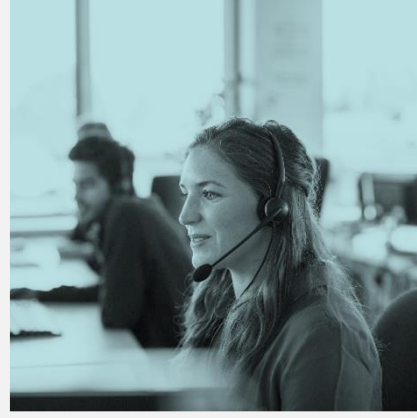
## Policy Research

NCSL provides trusted, nonpartisan policy research and analysis



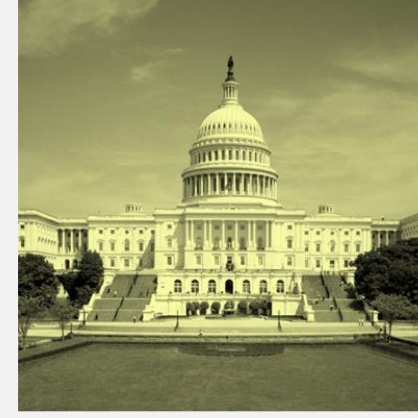
## Connections
