

2021 Title V Program Highlights

family planning and reproductive health visits/services provided 3.030 clinical and non-clinical professionals participated in Maternal and Infant Mortality Summit 400+ people expanded their breastfeeding education. Five (5) candidates qualified to sit for lactaction consultant certification (IBCLC) & twelve (12) home visitors completed breastfeeding counselor 17 training. crib cards and safe sleep education distributed in 21 of 36 birthing hospitals 60,000 home visits completed [Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV), 45,945 Healthy Start, High Risk Perinatal Program (HRPP)] car seats with education materials distributed to Safe Kids Partners including county 4,270 health departments infants, children and women received preventive oral health care, risk assessment and 9,000 anticipatory guidance.
