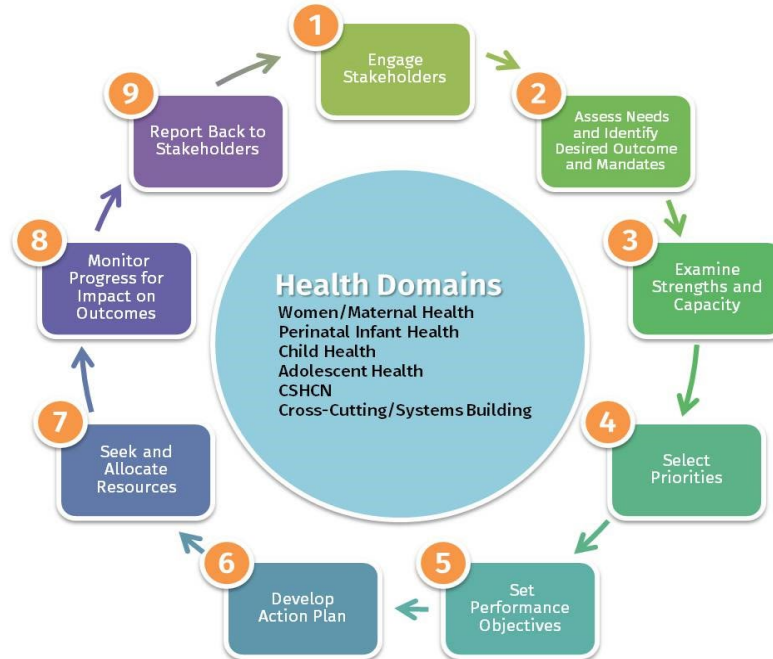

car seats with education materials distributed to Safe Kids Partners including county health departments

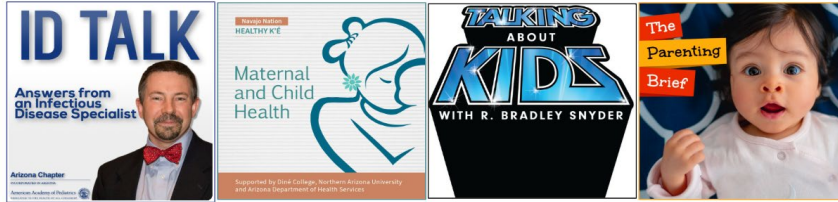
