But they also can be pathways out of homelessness!

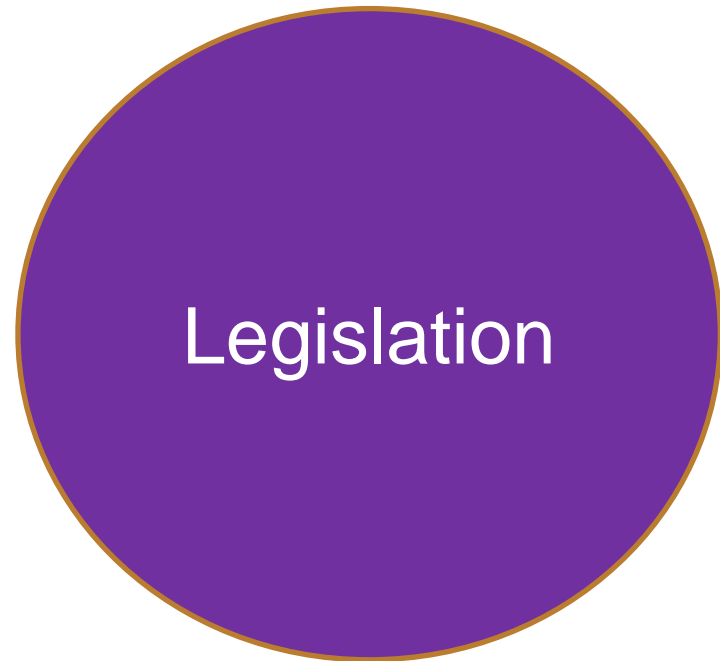


Making systems pathways out of homelessness

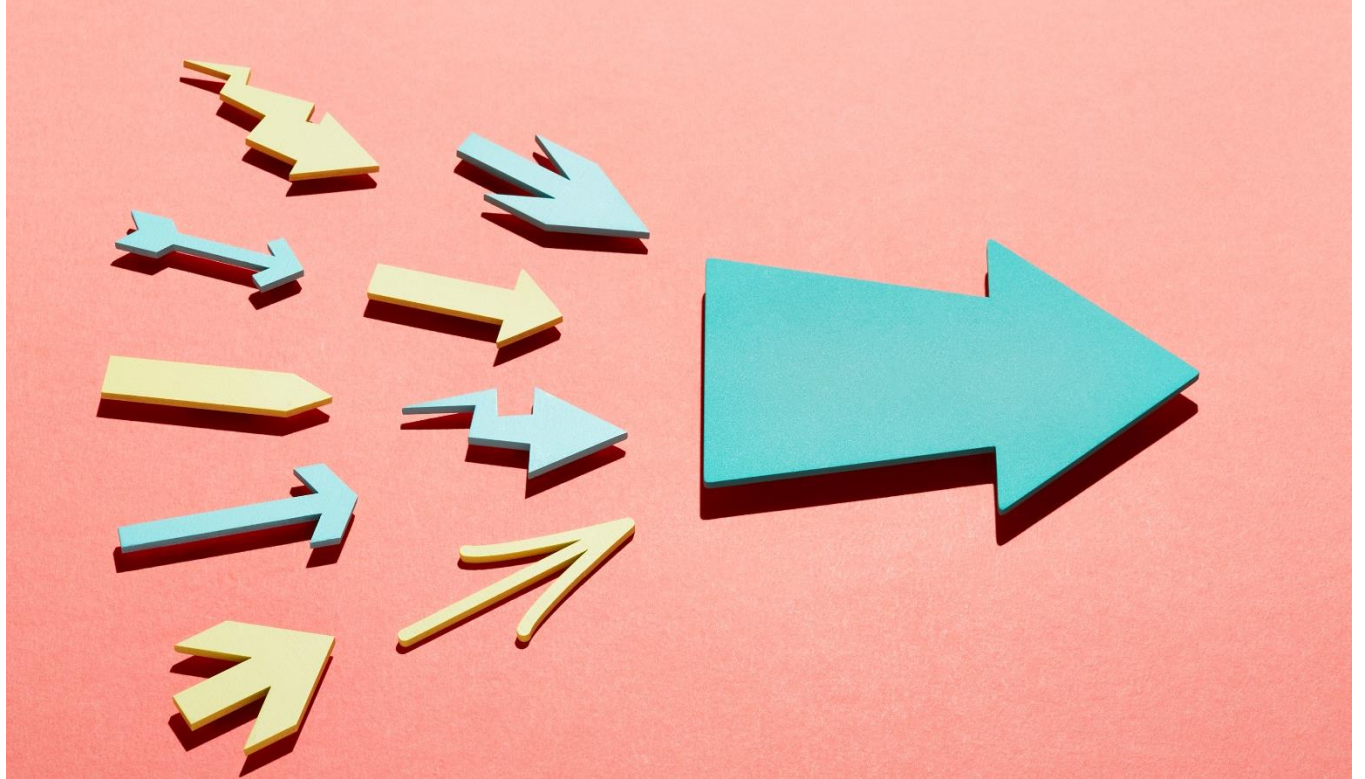

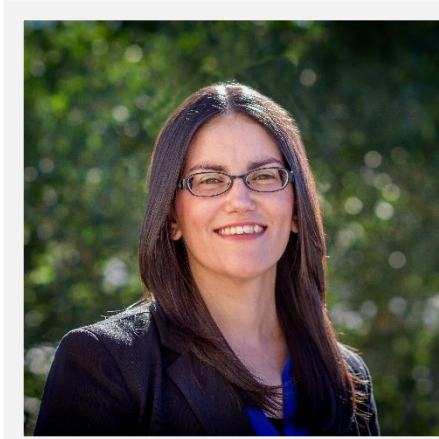

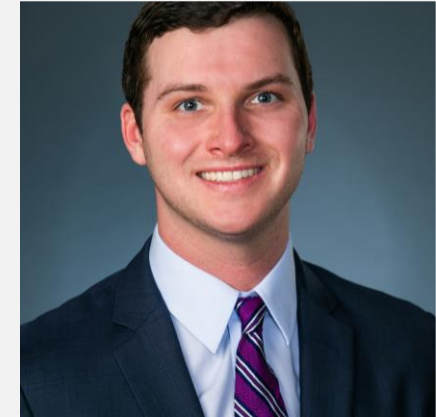
