Military Matters: 2023 Key Issues


The Defense-State Liaison Office works with Defense Department leaders and other stakeholders to choose 10 issues to focus on each year.

2023 New Issues

Defining Armed Forces in State Policy

Recent force structure changes require updates to ensure that states' definitions of military service comport with federal law.

Licensure Exemptions for Military Family Child Care Providers

In many cases, military family child care providers must be licensed or registered by the state in addition to the military. By exempting providers already certified through the military, states enhance the economic status of both providers and families.

Military and Family Life Counselor Licensure Waiver

The state licensure process can be a barrier to providing timely mental health support to service members and families. States can provide a licensure waiver for military and family life counselors to allow for mental health care as needed.
