


Occupational Licensing Legislation Database



2021/2022 Recap

- 2021: 16 states enacted 20 bills
- 2022: 12 states enacted 20 bills (still tracking)
- Applying military certification towards licensure
- Exempts residency requirements
- Licensure by endorsement
- Creates provisional licenses
- Waiving licensing fees
- Clear information on board websites


