KAREN KEISER 4 5 WHEREAS, Employers continue to need highly skilled employees to fill jobs in nearly all 6 7 sectors in the economy, 8 9 WHEREAS, the potential for an expanded registered apprenticeship program in the 10 United States can help workers reconnect to the economy while enhancing their skills 11 and opportunities, and 12 WHEREAS, innovative new registered apprenticeship programs in non-traditional 13 14 economic sectors such as health care, technology, and personal services will open 15 pathways for increased diversity and inclusion in those occupations, and 16 17 WHEREAS, the traditional "earn while you learn," approach of registered apprenticeship 18 will reduce economic barriers to higher skilled occupations that currently are limited to 19 paid tuition and fee based courses, and 20 21 WHEREAS, the traditional "on-the-job" learning requirements of registered 22 apprenticeship are a successful learning style for many students who prefer learning 23 skills through hands-on experience in addition to tradition classroom coursework, and 24 25 WHEREAS, providing incentives to employers to participate in registered apprenticeship 26 programs in non-traditional sectors through tax policies and apprentice utilization 27 agreements, when combined with long-term employer commitments, will establish a 28 sustainable future for apprenticeship programs, and

- 2 financially sustainable and jointly managed create tens of thousands high wage and high
- 3 skilled jobs to ensure future generations of skilled apprentices for high demand
- 4 occupations in our country, and

- 7 non-traditional occupations will take significant resources and support from the United
- 8 States Department of Labor,

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- 13 THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the NCSL support federal initiatives and funding to
- 14 expand state registered apprenticeship programs into non-traditional occupations and
- 15 careers, considering best practices and policies found in other countries.

WHEREAS, The National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) strongly urges the federal government to better coordinate its economic development activities with the states.

 WHEREAS, NCSL urges the U.S. Department of Commerce, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the U.S. Department of Labor and the Small Business Administration to each establish a designated liaison to coordinate economic development activities among the four agencies and with the states.

WHEREAS, NCSL encourages the federal government to support arts and culture through investments in State and Local programs that will promote economic development, job creation and community revitalization.

WHEREAS, NCSL encourages collaboration and coordination among the Federal Government's disparate arts, culture and economic development agencies as they consider State and local programs ensure that the policy and program outcomes meet the needs and goals identified by state policymakers.

WHEREAS, In order to train and maintain a highly skilled workforce NCSL believes that states should be given flexibility to meet the broad goals set out in the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and that state discretion to establish and administer workforce development services should be maintained.

WHEREAS, Reauthorization of WIOA should not include inflexible federal mandates and restrictions on how funds can be used by states and the localities which deliver these services. In addition, workforce development reporting should be streamlined to promote program and administrative efficiencies.

WHEREAS, NCSL believes that the components of an integrated WIOA system should-be appropriately funded in appropriation and reauthorization.

THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that NCSL believes that administrative and technological funding for One-Stops should be central to WIOA appropriation and reauthorization.

WHEREAS, NCSL encourages the Congress and the Administration to support flexibility and state discretion in housing programs and avoid unfunded mandates.

WHEREAS, NCSL encourages efforts to promote a greater state role in administering federal housing programs, subject to sufficient funding and flexibility.

 WHEREAS, NCSL is encouraged and supportive of public private partnership programs and initiatives that increase the availability of financing for homeownership opportunities. NCSL supports first time home buyer tax credits to promote homeownership prospects, preserving the Mortgage Interest Deduction, and low-income housing tax credits that produce new, affordable housing.

WHEREAS, NCSL strongly urges the federal government to consult state legislators and other state officials as voucher program reforms are designed to ensure that they will meet state needs, provide the flexibility we desire, avoid cost shifts to states, and continue with ample federal funding for program and administrative costs.

WHEREAS, NCSL urges the Congress to sustain funding levels sufficient to maintain existing vouchers, including the Department of Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) programs and already committed project based Section 8 subsidies.

 WHEREAS, The federal government should provide additional funding and support the authority of states for flexibility to allocate some funds through a competitive grant administered by the state in pursuit and support of innovative, high quality and effective programs.

WHEREAS, NCSL believes that CTE competitive grant programs should be used to incentivize and modernize state and local programs in order to meet the evolving needs of students. NCSL supports adequate funding for CTE competitive grant programs.
