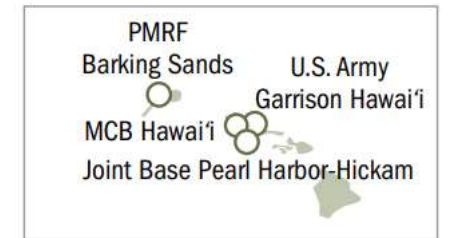

- 7 Fort Polk (Future Fort Johnson), Louisiana

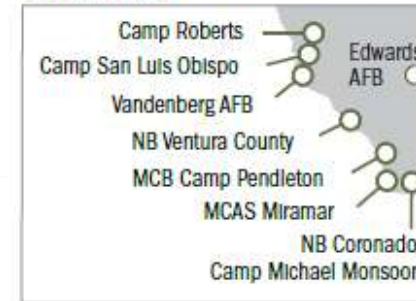

Georgia Sentinel Landscape – 2022 America the Beautiful Project

- The Georgia Sentinel Landscape hosts nine key DOD facilities, with the military supporting over \$13 billion in the state’s economy.
- Longleaf pine forests are an essential part of the Georgia habitats, forest products, and recreation opportunities.
- The America the Beautiful Challenge project will build on the West Central Georgia Prescribed Fire Initiative to execute prescribed burns on over 20,000 acres of private land and 5,000 acres of public land.



Keesler Air Force Base – 2022 NCRF Project

- Keesler Air Force Base trains over 30,000 officers, airmen, and civilian employees of the Air Force and hosts the only Air Force Reserve Command Wing in Mississippi.
- Mississippi State University will construct a 2.5-mile living shoreline using marsh sill and fill, native species planting, and segmented breakwaters to enhance the landscape’s resilience to climate change.
- This will serve as the second largest living shoreline project along the Mississippi coast.

OLDCC Installation Resilience Program

- Installation Resilience program activities are designed to support the organizing, planning, and implementation actions necessary to foster, protect, and enhance the sustainability of our military installations.
- States are eligible to apply directly to OLDCC. OLDCC will then evaluate existing or potential resilience and encroachment issues to determine if a project is reasonable and beneficial to supporting the military mission.

Spectrum Encroachment	Marine Resources
Endangered Species	Security
