Port Tampa handles 33 million tons of cargo each year and spans approximately 5,000 acres. It offers weekly containerized cargo services and is a major cruise homeport. Port Tampa is strategically located to serve the Tampa Bay/Orlando I-4 Corridor, which is home to a large concentration of distribution centers and allows for efficient distribution throughout Florida and beyond. The Port Tampa boat tour will offer an educational overview of the Port and highlight the operations of the region's largest economic engine.
