  - Data security.

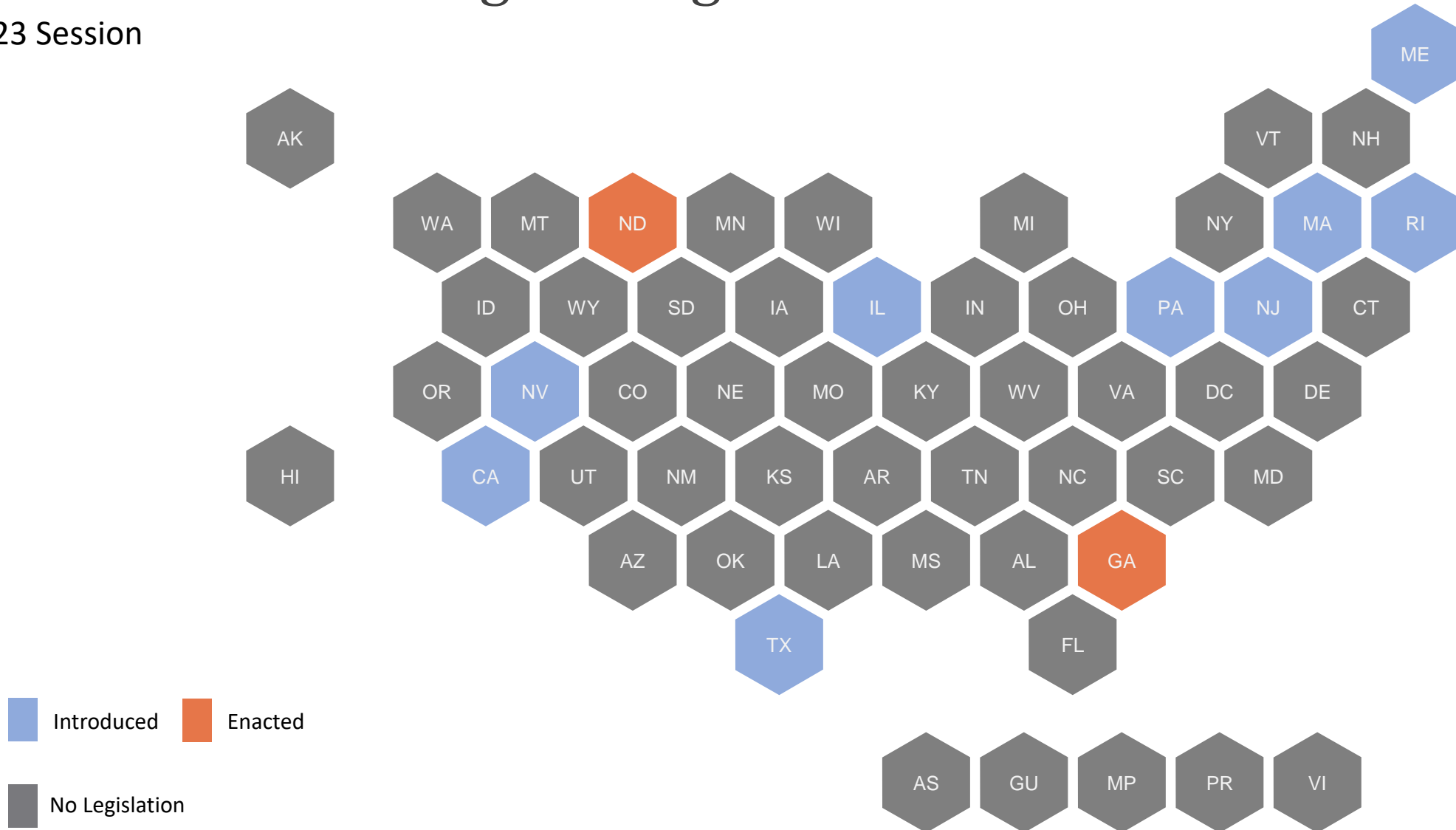
**67% of Americans support greater regulation of emerging AI technologies.**

# 2023 Legislative Examples



California  
AB 1502

**Pending:** Prohibits a health plan from discriminating against protected classes through the use of clinical algorithms in its decision-making.



Georgia  
HB 203

**Enacted:** Provides regulations for the use of an assessment mechanism being used to conduct eye exams.



Illinois  
HB 1002

**Pending:** Requires that algorithms used to diagnose patients are certified and achieve accurate results. Certifies that patients have the right to know that an algorithm diagnosed them and allows them to opt-out of its use.

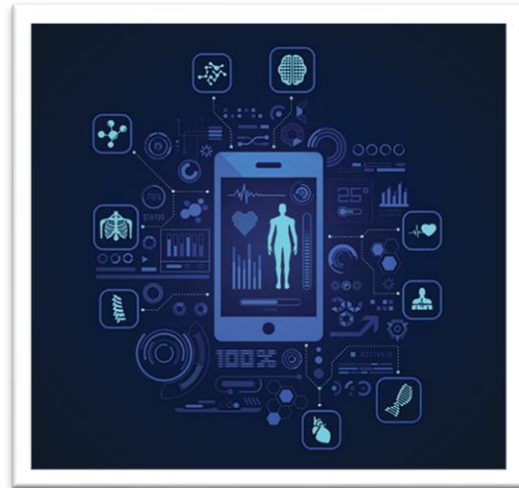


Texas  
HB 4695

**Failed:** Requires artificial intelligence mental health services to be conducted by a licensed mental health professional and sets parameters for its use.

# Legislative Examples: Simulation



Alabama (2023)  
SB 87

**Enacted:** Allocates \$1,000,00 for the development of health simulation equipment at the University of South Alabama.



New York (2023)  
SB 447

**Enacted:** Requires nursing certificate and degree education to include clinical education and allows for a portion of that education to be completed through simulation experience.



Tennessee (2022)  
HB 1956

**Enacted:** A training program offered by an emergency medical technician training center may utilize online or virtual interactive training for didactic instruction.



Washington (2023)  
SB 5693

**Enacted:** Allocates around \$12.5 million dollars towards purchasing or upgrading simulation laboratory equipment for nursing education.
