





President Biden, USDOT Announce More Than \$573 Million in Available Funding from the New Railroad Crossing Elimination Program

Thursday, June 30, 2022

Following this week's tragic fatal crashes, President's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides a total of \$3 billion over five years for a new program that will improve safety in communities, reduce wait times at railroad crossings, and help freight move goods more efficiently and affordably



Federal Program

- Authorizes a new General Fund program for the Elimination of grade crossings.
- Creates multiple eligibilities for Grade Separations, track reconfiguration, surface road redesign, etc.
- Authorizes \$5.5 billion in total spending Pre-Appropriates \$3.0 billion in funding.
- Congress could use the additional authorization and include another \$2.5 billion over the next 5 years.
- That could total \$5.5 billion in spending on issues surrounding public at-grade crossings.
- Applications are due by October 4, 2022 at 5 p.m.
